



Lower effective power rate benefiting from system diversity and lower fuel and purchased power costs


Higher base rate offset by lower fuel rate

FY17 data has been adjusted to incorporate a change in TVA's current calculation of total degree days




TVA saw the highest total energy for one week in our history, delivering 4,792 GWh

Four of the top 7 energy days in TVA history occurred during this cold wave


From January 15-22, 2024, TVA served 8 consecutive days of peak load above 29,000 MW
