Construction Update

Light poles are once again erected on Boone Dam's earthen embankment. (Photo at left.)

Five light poles returned to their original positions along the crest of the dam last week. They were removed earlier to allow the crest to be lowered and resurfaced with gravel. The next step will be pouring a concrete pad over the rock surface of the earthen embankment's road.

The embankment is now ten feet lower and quite a bit wider than before. This wider, sturdier, concrete platform will provide a safe work area for drill rigs to begin a more detailed testing program in January.

Boone Lake Levels

As you know, the Tri-Cities area has been wetter than normal the past several weeks. As part of TVA's mission to help prevent flooding, we manage the South Holston River and Boone Reservoir as a part of the whole Tennessee River system. Heavy rains require us to move water through Boone more quickly so that we can maintain the lake levels between 1,350 and 1,355 feet above sea level. Some fluctuations in lake level are a normal part of maintaining a safe water level while we complete the Boone repair project.
