Environmental Assessment Public Meeting Set for Nov. 5

TVA will release a draft environmental assessment on the impacts of the Boone Dam Project to the public on Wednesday, Oct. 28, for public review and comment. As announced by TVA in July, the environmental review is necessary to comply with the National Environmental Policy Act. NEPA reviews the potential environmental effects of TVA's proposal to remediate seepage at Boone Dam. The process seeks public input in order for TVA to identify, avoid and mitigate potential environmental effects of the proposed project. The public is invited to attend the NEPA public meeting on Thursday, Nov. 5, from 5:30-7:30 p.m. at Daniel Boone High School, 1440 Suncrest Drive, Johnson City, Tennessee.
