100,000 Safe Work Hours

On September 21, team members completed 100,000 safe work hours for the Boone Project. Some of the activities conducted during this period include test grouting, infrastructure improvements, site preparation for construction, environmental surveys, and investigative studies.

Fish Habitat Improvement

TVA water resources specialist Shannon O'Quinn (left) braved rainy weather to brief Tri-Cities residents, including Elyse Batista, on a Boone fish habitat improvement project during a public information session on September 26. Developed in conjunction with Tennessee Wildlife Resource Agency fisheries biologists, the project will seed up to 400 acres of public and private shoreline with perennial grasses and plants to create improved fish habitats when lake levels return to normal levels.
