Three Boone Boat Ramps Now Open for Summer Fun: Pickens Bridge Expansion Nearly Complete

All three Boone Lake boat ramps are now open for public recreation and enjoyment. In addition to the new ramps at Boone beach and Sugar Hollow access area near Devault Bridge, work is nearly complete at Pickens Bridge ramp expansion project. The new, paved access road into the Pickens Bridge boat ramp (photo at right) is now 10 feet wider, allowing for easy two-way traffic. The boat ramp itself is 15 feet wider. Some final clean-up items, including gates and trash cans at Sugar Hollow, should be completed in the coming days.

<u>Community News: Seedlings Planted at Beaver Creek, Sinking Creek, Boone Lake</u>

Nearly 20 members of the Boone Watershed group and the Boone Lake Association pitched in last weekend to plant 500 seedlings donated through a joint partnership with TVA and Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency. The Button Bush, Water Hickory and Bald Cyprus tree seedlings were given to Dennis Scheer, an officer in both organizations, who distributed to the members for planting. The vegetation creates future fish habitats and helps prevent erosion.
