### **Construction Update: New Swim Beach at Boone**

Even the snow flurries at Boone Dam last week couldn't stop us from thinking about the lazy days of summer as 1,800 tons of white sand arrived at the site for construction of a new swim beach. Work is also continuing on a new boat ramp that is scheduled to open around Memorial Day along with the swimming area. Both of the new facilities are located just north of Boone Dam along Minga Road.

### **Meet Your Neighbors: Jack Stanhope**

Jack Stanhope makes things happen. He was one of the first people brought onsite to begin the remediation effort at Boone Dam and recalls seeing the dark brown seepage just below the dam in October 2014. He immediately went to work to stop the problem, bringing several men and heavy equipment to the dam. They carved out a road below the dam and "plugged" the leak as a stopgap measure to maintain safety of those downstream.

As project superintendent, Jack oversees all construction activities in the field and works with contractors to provide oversight of the project. He also serves as a liaison between construction and the plant operations group. "I'm a 'Jack' of all trades," he laughs.

### **REMINDER: Sluicing Operations Could Resume This Week**
