TENNESSEE VALLEY AUTHORITY (TVA) – BULL RUN FOSSIL PLANT (BRF) – NPDES PERMIT NO. TN0005410 – EFFLUENT LIMITATION GUIDELINES NOTICE OF PLANNED PARTICIPATION (NOPP)

On October 13, 2020, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) published revisions to the Steam Electric Effluent Limitation Guidelines (ELGs) in 40 CFR Part 423. The revised rule modifies technology-based effluent limitations for Flue Gas Desulfurization (FGD) wastewater and Bottom Ash Transport Water (BATW). In setting stringent new effluent limitations, EPA recognized the need to provide compliance flexibility by establishing new subcategories that provide different compliance pathways based on unit operation and asset operating plans and by allowing transfers between subcategories.

The EPA established a new subcategory for facilities planning to cease coal combustion by December 31, 2028, ("retirement subcategory"). Best available technology economically achievable (BAT) effluent limitations for FGD wastewater and BATW discharges in the retirement subcategory are equivalent to the limits for total suspended solids (TSS) in § 423.12(b)(11) and § 423.12(b)(4), respectively. In 40 CFR 423.19(f), the ELG Rule lists the requirements for the retirement subcategory which include submission of a NOPP with specified contents as well as an annual progress report that provides updates on the NOPP contents.

On February 14, 2019, the TVA Board of Directors voted to retire BRF by December 1, 2023. This letter serves as TVA's NOPP in the retirement subcategory for FGD wastewater and BATW for the only coal combustion unit at BRF. The expected date to achieve permanent cessation of coal combustion is December 1, 2023. TVA is not regulated by a public service commission; therefore, approval of this regulatory body is not applicable. The Energy Resource Options presented in TVA's 2019 <a href="Integrated Resource Plan">Integrated Resource Plan</a> include the planned retirement of BRF. Milestones that either have been completed or would need to be completed to achieve retirement are listed in the table below:
