
TVA DISPERSED POWER PRODUCTION (DPP) ONLINE REGISTRATION PROCESS

What is the DPP program? The [Dispersed Power Production program \(DPP\)](#) allows companies or residential customers to produce renewable energy and sell all or excess generation back to TVA at TVA's avoided cost.

How do I enroll? You can enroll in the DPP program online through the TVA DPP website. Please see below for information on how to register and enroll.


What do I need to provide during enrollment?

1. You must have an executed [interconnection agreement](#) (IA) between you (either as an individual or a business, if applicable) and your local power company.
2. You must provide your [banking & tax information](#) to receive payments – this information will be gathered using a secure signature platform later in the enrollment process. The information request will be sent by email along with the signature request for your DPP contract. These requests will be sent through a secure signature system called DocuSign.

2. Follow the prompts that request your system address, the address type, residential or commercial/industrial, your utility company name, and your contact information.
3. Then select your “Solar Output Delegation” to indicate how you want to sell your generation back. The options are:
 - a. Use the generation from your system and sell any excess generation – select the 1st option if you want to go this route.
 - b. Sell all your generation from your system – select the 2nd option if you want to go this route.
2. Click the “continue” button and complete the blank fields. Here are some tips that may be helpful:
 - a. **Facility Name** should be entered as the name that appears on customer’s electric account (see a recent bill).
 - b. **System Size** should be entered in kW DC; you should be able to find this information listed on your interconnection application or agreement.
 - c. **Facility Type** individual, business or corporation.
 - d. **Generation Type** the type of facility that will be generating the generation.
 - e. **Anticipated Delivery Date** should be entered as the anticipated date that the system will begin generating. This date should occur after the interconnection agreement has been executed.
 - f. If contact address is different than facility address, please enter that information here, if they are the same select continue.
3. To initiate your DPP enrollment, you must have an interconnection agreement (IA) established with the local power company.
 - a. You will need to upload an executed copy of your IA in the document upload section of the enrollment form. You may still submit the form if you do not upload your IA, but your enrollment will not be processed until an executed IA is provided. The file must be smaller than 15mb and the following file types are accepted, txt, doc, docx, xls, xlsx, jpg, jpeg, png and pdf.
4. Once your DPP enrollment has been reviewed, you will receive two emails sent to your email on file from Dispersed Power Production: the 1st email will be an electronic request for your banking information and W9 completion, and the 2nd email will request your electronic signature on your DPP Contract. These forms are completed through a secure e-signature service (DocuSign), and both forms must be completed in full to finalize your enrollment.
5. After the TVA portion of the DPP Contract is signed, you will receive an emailed PDF copy of your final DPP Contract to your email on file. You will then be eligible to receive payment for your generation reported to TVA.
