

Public Input Enhances TVA's Integrated Resource Planning

TVA's 2024 Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) has the potential to impact every resident and business in the seven-state region it serves.

YES. It's that important.

The 2024 IRP will help shape TVA's energy system of the future, ensuring that people have affordable, reliable, resilient and clean energy for decades to come. TVA also will produce an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) that evaluates the environmental impacts of potential decisions in the IRP.

But TVA can't do it alone. It needs stakeholders' robust and diverse opinions to broaden its lens and challenge its assumptions, which, in turn, will strengthen the planning process.

TVA has sought input since it announced the IRP process would start in May 2023, and it will continue to garner

feedback until the process is completed in summer 2024.

The agency has formed a diverse working group of stakeholders who meet regularly to provide guidance on the IRP. To engage the public, it has scheduled periodic webinars that offer IRP updates, and it will hold informational open houses and seek public comments when the Draft IRP and Draft EIS are released in spring 2024. TVA also has an [IRP website](#) that provides the latest information.

At every turn, TVA is incorporating environmental justice considerations – which address disproportionate health, environmental, economic and climate impacts on disadvantaged communities – into its IRP and EIS processes.

With input from stakeholders, TVA is creating an IRP that will achieve TVA's mission of making life better for everyone in the region.
