

Public Input Enhances TVA's Integrated Resource Planning

TVA's Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) has the potential to impact every resident and business in the seven-state region it serves.

YES. It's that important.

The IRP will help shape the TVA region's future energy system, ensuring that people have affordable, reliable, resilient and increasingly cleaner energy for decades to come. TVA also will produce an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) that evaluates the potential environmental impacts of options analyzed in the IRP.

But TVA can't do it alone. It needs stakeholders' robust and diverse opinions to broaden its lens and challenge its assumptions, which, in turn, will strengthen the planning process.

TVA has sought input into the IRP since the process started in May 2023, and TVA will continue to garner

feedback until the process is completed.

The agency has formed a diverse working group of stakeholders who meet regularly to provide guidance on the IRP. To engage the public, TVA has scheduled periodic webinars that offer IRP updates and will hold informational open houses and seek public comments when the draft IRP and draft EIS are released. An environmental justice focus is being applied to IRP engagements, with the objective to reach and gain valuable input from all communities.
