

Request for Proposal Notice

2026 Resource Solicitation Cluster Request for Proposals (2026 RSC RFP)

Introduction:

This announcement constitutes a Request for Proposal (RFP) notice soliciting proposals from qualified independent power producers, integrators and providers to design, engineer, build, operate, and maintain new energy resources pursuant to the qualifications below. The pending RFP does not constitute a commitment, implied or otherwise, that TVA will take action in this matter. TVA will not be responsible for any costs incurred in furnishing TVA responsive information.

TVA is interested in entering into Power Purchase Agreements and/or Energy Storage Agreements (collectively PPAs) to provide energy resource attributes such as energy, capacity, grid ancillary services, and environmental attributes to TVA. Proposed energy resources must be directly interconnected to TVA facilities pursuant to TVA's Large Generator Interconnection Procedure (LGIP) (Projects greater than 20MW). TVA sought resources identified in TVA's resource plan may be studied alongside those Energy Resources selected for progression to a PPA via this upcoming RFP.

General Background:

- TVA is a corporate agency of the United States that provides electricity for business customers and local power companies, serving more than 10 million people in parts of seven southeastern states. TVA receives no taxpayer funding, deriving its revenues from sales of electricity. In addition to operating and investing its revenues in its electric system, TVA provides flood control, navigation, and land management for the Tennessee River system and assists local power companies and state and local governments with economic development and job creation.
- As a corporate agency and instrumentality of the federal government, proposed projects are required to undergo environmental review, which must be completed prior to any ground disturbance, tree clearing, or grading of the proposed site. Furthermore, the submission of a proposal constitutes the beginning of TVA action and thus initiates the aforementioned limitations.
- The proposed action is in alignment with TVA's goal of building a robust energy system to power future load growth and implementation of its target power supply mix identified in its Integrated Resource Plan ("IRP").

Energy Resource Qualifications and RFP Assumptions:

- TVA seeks up to 1500MW of natural gas (NG) generation and will review proposals for other new energy resources interconnected to TVA subject to LGIP.
- All energy resource proposals will align with the terms and conditions in the TVA template PPA(s) or term sheet(s).
- Market participants should reference interconnection information via TVA OASIS website including the TVA heatmap.
- Energy resources must be interconnected to TVA's system and able to establish an interconnection queue position within the timeframe specified in the RFP schedule.
- Interested parties should register on the Power Advocate platform no later than February 18, 2026.

Submissions:

TVA will utilize PowerAdvocate, a web-based platform to organize all RFP documents and communicate with correspondents. The intended date of the initial document release to include RFP documents and exhibits (RFP package) is February 23, 2026. Respondents shall review the RFP package, message TVA, and submit their proposals and RFP related communications through PowerAdvocate.

The due diligence and question period will continue up until the proposal submittal deadline April 14, 2026. Proposal submittals will require bid security and a bid submission fee as provided by the RFP package.

After reviewing responses, TVA may request additional information or may schedule individual meetings with any respondent to gain additional information about the proposal.

Confidentiality

TVA recognizes that certain information contained in proposals submitted may be considered confidential and, as permitted by applicable law, will treat as confidential any information clearly labeled as such. If TVA is formally requested and required

by any regulatory or judicial authority, or is otherwise required by law, to disclose information with regard to a proposal, TVA will disclose such information in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.
